GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The chart below shows the minimum requirements needed to obtain a high school diploma in the state of North Carolina. In addition to the 22 credits required by NC, Edgecombe County Public Schools requires 6 additional credits, for a total of 28 credits needed to graduate.

GPA AND CLASS RANK

Grade point averages (GPA) are calculated at the end of each semester. GPAs, both weighted and unweighted, are shown on your high school transcript. Your weighted GPA determines your class rank GPA is calculated by dividing your total quality points (all years) by your total number of credits attempted (all years). YOUR GPA WILL NOT CHANGE UNTIL FIRST SEMESTER GRADES ARE FINALIZED AND NEW CALCULATIONS ARE COMPLETED. Your final GPA and class rank will be reported on your final high school transcript. Unofficial high school transcripts will be included in the envelope with your final report card & diploma that you will receive at graduation. Remember that GPA and Class Rank are factors in determining college admission.

NC ACADEMIC SCHOLARS ENDORSEMENT

IN 1983, THE NC STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION CREATED WHAT HAS BEEN KNOWN AS THE NC ACADEMIC SCHOLARS PROGRAM. THESE STUDENTS WILL BE RECOGNIZED AT SENIOR RECOGNITION NIGHT IN MAY AND WILL RECEIVE A SEAL ON THEIR DIPLOMA AND A WHITE HONOR CORD.

A. The student shall complete the Future-Ready Core mathematics sequence of Math I, II, III and a fourth mathematics course that meets University of North Carolina system Minimum Admission Requirements such as AFM or Pre-Calculus

B. The student shall complete three units of science including an Earth/Environmental science course, Biology, and at least one physical science course that must include either physics or chemistry.

C. The student shall complete four units of social studies including World History; American History: Founding Principles, Civics and Economics; and American History I and American History II (or AP US History).

D. The student shall complete two units of a world language (other than English).

E. The student shall complete four elective credits constituting a concentration recommended from one of the following: Career and Technical Education (CTE), JROTC, Arts Education, Second Languages, any other subject area.

F. The student shall have taken two higher level courses during junior and/or senior years which carry quality points such as Advanced Placement, Dual or college equivalent courses, Advanced CTE and CTE credentialing courses, Online courses, Honors level courses and a Graduation Project (Graduation Project is mandatory in Senior English Classes)...

G. The student shall earn an unweighted grade point average of at least 3.50.

HONOR GRADUATES

Honor Graduates must have a four year <u>weighted</u> GPA of 3.83. Averages are calculated through the 5th six weeks of second semester. Honor Graduates will receive honor cords at Senior Recognition Night in May.

APPLYING TO COLLEGE & COLLEGE FOUNDATION OF NORTH CAROLINA

CFNC.org has a wealth of information regarding planning, applying and paying for college. Students are encouraged to use this site to apply to colleges and universities within North Carolina. Most students should already have a CFNC account. Please use the account name and password recovery feature to get this information. If this does not work, please see a counselor for this information.

You will be able to view all your historical and recent transcript submittal information in the Application Hub. The Application Hub can be used to apply to NC Colleges and Universities, request your official high school transcript, and track the progress of your admission process tasks such as applications for admission, electronic high school transcripts, housing forms, etc.

COLLEGE APPLICATION WEEK

The goal of North Carolina College Application VVeek is to provide every graduating high school senior the opportunity to apply to college online through CFNC.org. Special focus is placed on students who would be the first in their families to attend college and students who may have not otherwise seriously considered attending college.

During this statewide college access event, all North Carolina colleges and universities accept the College Board or ACT fee waiver, for students who qualify, in lieu of an application fee. Typically, students who receive the SAT or ACT fee waiver also qualify for the College Board fee waiver. See your high school counselor for more information about the College Board fee waiver. Additionally, many of North Carolina's colleges and universities go above and beyond and outright waive their application fee for all North Carolina graduating seniors that week

During NC College Application VVeek (November 13 through November 17) the following North Carolina colleges and universities will entirely waive the application fee for all North Carolina high school seniors applying online through CFNC.org:

during your senior year
3 units of Science
2 units of Social Studies
High School GPA: Weighted 2.5 or higher
SAT 880 (verbal and math combined) or ACT Composite of 17

ACT/SAT INFORMATION

WHAT ARE COLLEGE ADMISSION TESTS?

There are two tests, ACT and SAT, used by nearly all four-year colleges in NC as one of the admissions criteria. They are alike and different in several ways. Your best strategy is to Google: Compare ACT and SAT and take a few minutes reviewing the search results. Some students perform better on one than the other. Many students want to take each at least once. ACT & SAT scores can be used for placement purposes at community colleges as well.

<u>WHAT SCORE DO I NEED TO GET INTO COLLEGE?</u>

Many four-year college admissions are competitive. You can find the average scores for a particular school on CFNC.org or the college website. Universities in the UNC system require a minimum of 880 (math + reading) and 17 Composite Score on the ACT. Admission offices practice superscoring, meaning that if you make a higher score on one subtest at one sitting and higher score on another subtest on another test day, these may be combined to yield your best performance.

WHEN SHOULD I TAKE THE ACT OR SAT?

We encourage you to take two of the same tests whether it's the ACT or SAT. It's up to you! All students take the ACT as a Junior so you already have one set of scores. Many college deadlines are in the early spring so it's best to do your testing in the fall. Some schools do have rolling admissions so it's best to look at the deadlines for colleges you wish to attend!

WHAT DOES REGISTRATION INVOLVE?

Both tests ask for extensive information regarding your high school education and your plans for the future. You may want to set aside some time to complete the registration. You will be asked to upload a clear face picture. When registering, remember to use the code of the schools in which you have an interest in applying. You should be able to send scores to four colleges for free. You will have to pay for any additional score reports beyond the four.

There is a fee for each test and you may pay with debit/credit cards. If your family meets certain economic criteria, you may qualify for a fee waiver. See Mrs. Gay for information on fee waivers.

HOW FAR IN ADVANCE DO I NEED TO REGISTER?

Both test sites will give you dates for regular and late registration. Don't wait until the last minute. You will also need a photo ID when you arrive at the test site. If you do not have a Photo ID see your counselor for other options.

<u>HOW CAN I PREPARE FOR THESE TESTS?</u>

At minimum, you will want to visit the ACT and SAT sites to read about the format of the test and see some sample questions. Each site will offer additional tools. Khan Academy is also a good resource for test prep.

FAFSA - FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID

To apply for federal student aid, such as federal grants, work-study, and loans, you need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Completing and submitting the FAFSA is free and easier than ever, and it gives you access to the largest source of financial aid to pay for college or career school.

In addition, many states and colleges use your FAFSA information to determine your eligibility for state and school aid, and some private financial aid providers may use your FAFSA information to determine whether you qualify for their aid.

<u>All students planning to attend college should complete the FAFSA</u>. Here are some helpful tips for completing the FAFSA:

- 1. Each student and <u>one</u> parent should apply for a FSA ID at **fsaid.ed.gov**. Make sure to keep a record of the parent's and student's email addresses, their answers to the security questions, and both FSA IDs/passwords. Keep this information in a secure place. You'll need this information to sign the FAFSA.
- 2. Completing the 2017-18 FAFSA on the Web Worksheet in advance will help you get familiar with what's on the electronic version you'll be completing and submitting. This worksheet available at fafsa.gov.
- 3. Students will be able to submit their FAFSA starting <u>Oct. 1, 2017</u>. Parents will use their financial data from 2016.
- 4. The IRS Data Retrieval Tool will hopefully be available for the upcoming FAFSA. . This tool will allow you to import income information electronically directly from the IRS. This greatly reduces the time it takes to complete the application
- 5. Do you need FREE help completing the FAFSA? FAFSA Day will be held Saturday, October 28, 2017. Locations may vary. Visit CFNC.org/FAFSAday to find a location near you! You will need to register online. The day of the event, you'll need to bring information from your 2016 tax filing. With that in hand, most families will be able to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool in the income/asset section of the FAFSA. Also bring your FAFSA ID's and passwords!

ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY IN COLLEGE

Students planning on playing sports in a Division I or II college must be declared academically eligible by the NCAA Eligibility Center. Student athletes must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at ncaa.org to register. A fee is required to register. Please contact your counselor with any questions.

SCHOLARSHIPS

There are literally thousands of scholarships out there if you are willing to take the time to do the research!
